Beginnings

Literacy and communication

Can you read the story of the term at home, and recognise familiar pictures of the book? We are reading 'That's my flower- Alice Hemming' this term.

Can you make your own characters to go with the story, or talk about what you can see?

Can you watch the story video on YouTube?

You could find some pictures of animals and see if you can identify the baby animals. Can you see the sheep and lamb, or can you see the cow and the calf?

Can you make a choice of what you would like to bake at home, can you choose from a choice of 2?

Maths

Fluency - Can you count how many new flowers you can see emerging in the community? Can you count the daffodils peeping through the grass?

Can you make some easter nest cakes, can you count how many eggs you can add onto your cake?

Can you count any baby animals in the fields? Can you see the lambs?

Topic

Our topic this term is 'beginnings', where will be exploring the life cycle of plants in the community. We will be planting our own flowers and watching the growth.

We will be making our own bird feeders; can you make some too?

Or you could make a wind chime for the garden and listen to some different sounds?
